PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Masters of Visual Anthropology (MVA) combines rigorous coursework in Anthropology and ethnographic research methods with hands-on training in documentary film production. Applicants for the Progressive Degree in the Masters of Visual Anthropology should have a strong academic record, with significant coursework in Anthropology or Visual Anthropology, cultural studies, or the humanistic social sciences. PDP Applicants are required to submit a research proposal, a statement of interest, and two letters of reference from faculty members who are able to assess the student's academic preparation. ANTH 575 may be applied in the Visual Anthropology undergraduate major as a replacement for either ANTH 475 or ANTH 476, with the approval of both the course instructor for ANTH 575 and the Anthropology Graduate Advisor. Undergraduates who earn a grade of B+ or better in ANTH 575 as undergraduates are not required to take the course for the MVA.

Exceptional students in the Visual Anthropology undergraduate major may request departmental approval to enroll in a 4-unit 500- or 600-level seminar in Visual Studies or Anthropology as a replacement for one of the 300- or 400-level electives required for the Visual Anthropology undergraduate degree, thereby eliminating the 4-unit elective requirement for the MVA.
