ACADEMIC & LEARNING DEVELOPMENT

The Kortschak Center

The Kortschak Center for Learning and Creativity provides academic support to help USC students make successful transitions to college. Meet with an academic coach through drop-in hours, attend workshops, and access online tools and resources for assistance with organization strategies, time and stress management, study skills, learning development, and more!

Math Center

The Math Center is run informally and is designed for easy drop-in usage. It works best to use the center as a study room, and it is a great place to meet up with your study partners and work on homework. Teaching Assistants and Math Center Assistants are available for occasional questions if you need help.

Supplemental Instruction

Supplemental Instruction (SI) provides regularly scheduled, peer-led study sessions for various courses. Work in small, collaborative groups with your classmates, review lecture material, course reading, and homework, and go over exam strategies with SI leaders who know the course and professors.

Writing Center

The USC Writing Center provides free, one-on-one feedback to current USC students and helps with everything from essays to cover letters to scholarship applications.

Office of Student Accessibility Services (OSAS)

OSAS is the unit responsible for ensuring equal access for students with disabilities in compliance with state and federal law. Services include assistive technology, accommodated testing, and notetaking services.

Viterbi Learning Program (VLP)

The Viterbi Learning Program supports undergraduate students through peer mentoring, tutoring, academic skills workshops, and group study sessions, to help engineering and pre-engineering students learn better study habits and thrive in their classes.

Marshall Study Sessions

Marshall Study Sessions are a supplement to classroom instruction and are led by Peer Academic Leaders (PALs) who assist students in understanding difficult concepts and building study skills and confidence in selected Marshall core course subjects.

Economics Tutoring Center

The Economics Tutoring Center provides peer tutoring to students for select Economics courses. Review the center's site for weekly hours.
